This panel discussion explores the interconnected challenges of corruption and exclusion, by looking at the cost of getting into politics.

The discussion will be informed by <u>cross-country research</u> of the Westminster Foundation for Democracy (WFD) on how the cost of politics feeds into cycles of corruption. Speakers will explore the relationship between corruption, inclusiveness and accountability, taking lessons from the field to shed light on the implications for donors and practitioners.
